English:	<ul> <li>Sounds Like Phonics: <u>https://slp.cjfallon.ie</u>. Activity Book A -Unit 2 - The Market, Letter c</li> </ul>
	Follow this website to give you free access to online games: The children are familiar with these games from class.
	Practice writing the letter on paper and some words that begin with 'c' such as (cat, can, cob, cap). Break these words up before writing them e.g. cat - c/a/t/.

	<ul> <li>Continue to log on to the website Raz Kids <u>https://www.raz-kids.com/</u> every day and read the books assigned to your child in the 'My Assignments' section. Everyone should have received log in details via text last week. If you have issues logging in, please email us.</li> </ul>
Maths:	This week we are moving on to the number 0. Its important to grasp the concept that 0 means nothing.
	Try some hands-on activities e.g.
	<ul> <li>3 biscuits on one plate and 0 on another. How many biscuits do I have?</li> <li>I have 2 sweets. I give 0 sweets to Mam. How many sweets do I have left?</li> <li>Fill cups with pasta shells. Find the cups that have zero pasta shells.</li> </ul>
	<b>Worksheet</b> - Home Learning Documents. Practice writing the number 0. Use this rhyme to help them remember how to write it - ' Around and round and round we go, when we get home we have a zero'.

	Around and round and round we go, When we get home we have a zero.
History	Listen to the story 'What the Ladybird Heard' <u>https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=Mq_Pee53RpE&amp;t=35s</u>
	Ask questions about the story: What was your favourite part of the story? What noises did the animals make? Can you tell me what happened?
	The more they listen to the story, the better they will be able to sequence the story from beginning, middle and end.

Irish	This week we will continue to focus on 'The Television' - An Teilifís in Irish.
	The website Cula4 has lots of games to play and programmes in Irish to watch. <u>https://www.cula4.com/en/shows/cula4-ar-scoil/</u>
	At 10am each day on TG4 there is a show called 'Cúla 4 ar Scoil' which has Irish material suitable for Junior Infants.
Art	After listening to the story 'What the Ladybird Heard'. Can you create your own farm? What animals will be on your farm?
	You can draw it on a piece of paper. Or you could use your imagination and make it outside using leaves, grass, twigs stones and lots of other things.
